Jim Athanasiou

President & CEO

The St. Lawrence Seaway Management Corporation

Jim Athanasiou took over as President and Chief Executive Officer of the St. Lawrence Seaway Management Corporation (SLSMC) on July 12, 2024. In this role, he is responsible for the overall operation of the Canadian portion of the bi-national Seaway system.

Mr. Athanasiou joined the SLSMC in 2008 having worked in pulp and paper. In 2016, he was appointed Vice-President, Engineering and Technology and, just prior to his appointment as President and CEO, he led the SLSMC's team in negotiating a 20-year Management, Operation and Maintenance Agreement (MOMA) with the Federal Government.

Mr. Beaulieu currently sits on a number of boards of directors, and is member of various organizations and associations, amongst which the Marine Transportation Advisory Council, the Ministerial Advisory Council on Supply Chains and Internal Trade, the Cercle des présidents, the QG-100 Network and the Business Council of Canada.
